



Incoming and Outgoing Numbers (Japan)


Development since 2019

Growing Numbers

Until 2015, before JASEC was established, the exchange numbers were quite low – ranging from 2-3 students per year. Since then, the numbers have been growing continuously (except for the COVID time).

This year, we have a peak of about 50 Outgoing and 25 Incoming students.

On the occasion of the tragic Tohoku earthquake and subsequent tsunami in 2011, JASEC / TU Wien decided to support the restoration of a dilapidated historic model of a Japanese Daimyô-residence, that had been stored at the Weltmuseum (previously: Völkerkundemuseum) since the World's Fair in 1873, as a symbol for the restoration of the destroyed areas in Japan.


It is a symbol of peace and friendship between Austria and Japan.
